But one thing is certain, my lunch table conversations do not include any questions about my "relationship status".

We usually talk about how a colleagues' husband/wife reacted to a certain event; the food that's made by their husband/wife. We also talk about kids' education and how their little ones are growing up so fast!

In all this, never once has anyone asked me about my relationship/dating life?

Why is no one curious about this, even if they have known me for over 2 years now?

Did something change?

Sometimes, I feel the moment I outed myself to this group, they settled with the fact that if there is a change in my routine, I will share it firsthand and perhaps that's why they don't ask.

### Or

Maybe they don't ask because it's relationships we are talking, they don't last long, especially for queer folks. Btw Jack Baker and Michael McConnell, the first same-sex couple in United States history known to have obtained amarriage license, celebrated their 50th Marriage anniversary in 2021!

### Or

Maybe they feel its not right to ask a single man about their relationship status, especially when it's a queer guy. This perhaps trickles down from the general approach – we don't ask 30 something peeps about their marriage. But if it was a 30 something girl, she would have been asked about her marriage plans – how contrasting that its generally thought and taught that women folks are sensitive and men have a tough skin. Is it that a queer guy misidentified as a sensitive individual and hence treated differently?

## Or

May be its about keeping it simple – we don't talk about our partners. But then we do talk about the husbands, wife, in-laws, kids because they are family and are bound to be referred in general life update.

#### Or

Is it just a way to avoid confronting the real-ness that Queer folks go through. A citizen who is not permitted to get married; nominate same-sex partner as next of kin; not allowed to adopt a child or take medical decision on behalf of their same-sex partner. By not having these conversations or issues faced by queer folks, one is essentially ignoring us and the challenges queer folk's face. May be this isn't a lunch table conversation, but when is it an appropriate time or where will it be appropriate?

Pride month is a month to remind the society that queers exist and are surviving even if they are denied the basic human rights. The month of June is a reminder to pay homage to those who made the heaviest sacrifices to keep the flame burning even when the abuse of power felt like endless downpour. Pride month is a way for allies to come shoulder to shoulder and remind their queer folks that they are not alone in this fight for right!
